In the meantime, I thought I would hire a car for a couple of days as I needed transport to meet with colleagues etc. I got in contact with a hire company who asked for a photo of my driving licence for insurance purposes. Duly photographed and sent but then the hire company phoned back and said "We cannot help you this time as your licence has expired!" Well ... I mean, who checks their card-version driving licence? It is like many other things today, we need to renew licences, insurances, subscriptions and the like; so many things that now have an annual payment. #### Why have a Mentor??

Most of us throughout our lives have need of a mentor. A mentor being someone who provides guidance and encourages and empowers personal development. A mentor identifies and can correct gaps in our knowledge be it in schools, the workplace or in our church life. A mentor is someone who



believes in us and grows with us and by working together we can always learn from each other. Proverbs 27:17 sums it up well: "As iron sharpens iron so one person sharpens another." It's always good to tap into the knowledge and experience of someone further along in a role than ourselves. Godly mentorship plays a huge part in standing firm spiritually.

I have been very fortunate in the three years in my role as Authorised Local Preacher that I have had really good mentoring from those in authority which I have truly valued and have learned and am still learning valuable lessons from.

In the Bible we see many examples of good mentoring. The one I love reading about is the relationship between Elijah and Elisha. Elijah in I Kings 19 was told by God to anoint Elisha to succeed him as a prophet. Elisha, after encountering Elijah, let go of his work, possessions and family and set out to follow Elijah and became his servant.

By serving Elijah for some years Elisha learned through watching and helping his master and great was his commitment to his mentor, and on Elijah's death Elisha picked up his ministry. I Thessalonians 5:11 tells us to encourage one another and build each other up. In St. Leonard's Southminster and Steeple church we are always being encouraged by our leadership to take up new challenges and from them new ministries are being formed.



It is encouraged in our Christian walk, especially if taking up training for a new role, to have a spiritual advisor or mentor. We all need human input and especially the input and guidance from the Holy Spirit.

What an example Jesus was when He mentored his 12 disciples for 3 years. Not an easy task for Him at times with all their different personalities and differing stages of faith but he had called them and believed in them. Let us believe in each other and work with each other as we travel along in our life journeys and our own personal developments.

Even if you are unable to attend services regularly because of other Sunday commitments, your willingness to be part of the team in some way will be welcomed and appreciated.

The most recent special service (as we will go to print before Easter) was that on Mothering Sunday. It was great to see the children making suitable Mothering Sunday cards for their parents and grandparents. They were able to deliver them at the end of the service and to receive potted plants to give to the adults with them. Before work started on the belfry timber renovation project in 2022 we removed the wrought iron gates at the church entrance to avoid them getting damaged during the building works. These gates have historical significance because they were installed just after the end of WW2 as a thanksgiving for the return of peace. After exposure to 75 years of rain and road spray they were overdue for refurbishment. That work is now underway and we hope to have the gates back in position in time for Easter.
