Curate's Reflection

For the past three years, I haven't known where God would call me to serve as a vicar at the end of my curacy. I'm thrilled that my new appointment is only a short drive away because I've become so fond of the Dengie and each of you. I know the following statement by heart as the reality of moving on and my time here ending begins to set in.

We are delighted to announce that Rev Jacqui King, currently serving as Associate Curate in the Southminster and Steeple parishes, has been offered and accepted the invitation of the Bishop of Bradwell to be the next Vicar of Holy Trinity South Woodham Ferrers and Priest in Charge of St Andrew Bicknacre, St Mary Woodham Ferrers, and All Saints East Hanningfield - The Hill and Vale Churches.

I moved to the Dengie from Great Notley in Braintree, a purpose-built new garden village with a supermarket, doctors, pubs, schools, and parks, all connected by cycle paths. So, moving to The Vicarage in South Woodham Ferrers feels like returning to a familiar environment, although the population is much bigger. Also, the Anglican Church I moved from was an ecumenical church that worked in partnership with other denominations – Baptists, Methodists, Roman Catholics and the United Reformed Church. As Holy Trinity Church in South Woodham Ferrers is an 'ecumenical church' sharing its building with two other congregations (the Methodists and Roman Catholics) so again, it feels like I'm moving to a context that's familiar.

It was the rich diversity of The Hill and Vale Churches that attracted me to apply. I was drawn by the different

aesthetics of the church buildings, from modern brick and external rendering to historic village churches. The varied music with traditional hymns to contemporary guitar-led worship. The different services, from BCP morning prayer to Holy Communion and praise services. I love that each of the four churches has its unique identity, and together, they form a rich and inclusive community. The diverse range and number of schools in the parishes is another aspect that made me apply.

The parishes I'm moving to are called 'The Hill and Vale Churches' because they recognise that God is the God of the hills and the God of the valleys. God is not only present when we are on the mountain top, when we are happy and secure, but also when we are in the depths of a valley, when we are less cheerful and less confident. The scripture from I Kings 20:23,28 validates their vision which is to accompany the joyful but equally the sorrowful in each community. Tauren Wells' worship song 'Hills and Valleys' puts it beautifully - if on the mountain top, we stand in God's love, sensing his presence, and if in the valley, we bow our lives and submit to God, who will lift our eyes because he sees us and we will know we are not alone.

We never journey alone through life. We are always under the guidance and power of the Holy Spirit working in and through us as communities who minister to each other when we are full of the joys of Spring or when life is weighing us down. I will forever be thankful for how members of the churches and the wider community in Southminster and Steeple Benefice have ministered to me at different times — when I've lost confidence and felt insecure or when I've been

bubbling over with excitement. I'm grateful for every service, conversation, and opportunity that has shaped me into the priest that I am today.

I would be thrilled if you can come to either my farewell service which is at I I am on Sunday, 29th September 2024 in St Leonard's Church or my Licencing Service, with Bishop Adam, which is at 7.30pm on Monday, I4th October, at Holy Trinity Church, South Woodham Ferrers. Both services will be significant in my ministry so sharing with those who have been part of my journey and know me well would be wonderful.

May our God of the hills and the valleys continue to care for us in all that we are coping with and provide us with people who love and care for us whatever our circumstances.

I did it for a dare and it certainly wasn't on my "Bucket List" I raised a good amount of money for charity though which was a real bonus. Did I enjoy it? Yes and No, would I do it again? Almost certainly not. One thing I do know and continue to learn is that even in my later years, God has more than likely got more challenges for me and for you too, so buckle up and enjoy the ride and take that leap of faith when it comes.

You may remember Rebecca from when she came to St. Leonard's to talk about her charity which she founded called Replenish UK which is a charity supporting people struggling with their mental health.

Rebecca speaks from the heart in this powerful story of healing and restoration in her own life, reflecting on her childhood, its impact and her journey into healing through finding God.

Rebecca, through Replenish, is a great ambassador for helping people find the God who heals people broken through life's experiences and she has been brave enough to tell her own personal story. God uses her own difficult ex-

Lots of books are available on the shelves at the back of church for you to borrow and enjoy, and then - of course - return. If you have books that you don't need any more, speak with Christine Lucas about donating them to church.

$$\mathfrak{L}^{1/10} = 100$$

This equation is, by itself, incorrect or has something missing. Except, that is, when you are talking about the Christian community, what Jesus once described as 'good soil'.

"Still other seed fell on good soil. It came up, grew and produced a crop, some multiplying thirty, some sixty, some multiplying a hundred times."

Jesus was of course talking about people hearing and receiving the word of God, but it can also be applied to our use of money. St Leonard's Church has always supported charitable causes, for instance the Pillingers, Knightswood, the Royal British Legion and the Children's Society. Many Christians 'tithe' their income, that is set aside one tenth of their income to support the Church and/or charities. We know from personal experience, and also from the experience of the Church, how such giving can bring about all kinds of unexpected good that God has used, and, in effect, 'multiplied'. The term 'tithe' originated in Old Testament times, and it meant one tenth of a farmer's animals and grain, to be used for the Temple sacrifices, and also to support the priests who had no land of their own.

Over the last year St Leonard's PCC has discussed the idea of giving away one tenth of our Church income to good causes. This is based on a different Old Testament principle from the one mentioned above. When King David was moved to build a Temple to honour God he dedicated it in front of the people with a prayer that can be found in 1 Chronicles 29. In verse 14 he says: "But who am I, and who are my people, that we should be able to give as generously as this? Everything comes from you and we have given you only what comes from your hand."

As a Church, St Leonard's has been very well blessed over the years, and that includes having been blessed with money when needed. So the PCC decided to take its cue from God's generosity towards us and has voted to give away one tenth of its income every year. We will be publishing the list of charities shortly. If you have comments, questions, or ideas, please talk to a member of the PCC.


