#### A December Reflection by Rev'd Peter

### Advent

I wonder what it is that you are looking forward to this Christmas? Perhaps it is wrapping presents for others and the anticipated excitement of the recipient as they open the parcel. Perhaps it is meeting with others around a dinner table and having time to enjoy each other's company rather than a quick snack and on to the next 'job'. It may be that you are looking forward to Boxing Day when the rush is over and having the time to talk or play games.... Or simply snooze. As we sit to enjoy a movie over Christmas, we shall be bombarded with adverts for summer holidays, sunny beaches and blue seas and we may be tempted to look forward to plan a summer holiday. The hopes and dreams of planning ahead can make some winter evenings a more pleasant experience.

Alternatively, we may find joy in sharing memories of Christmas past; of loved ones and also some of the hilarious situations or incidents that we are reminded of at this time of the year.

It is important to hold all of these in balance: too much 'past' may sadden us because of how things 'used to be'. Too much 'future' and we have planned our life away – however, there are things that we need to plan very carefully for our future and for our families; specifically, though, for our future.

God has made a plan, a plan to establish a brighter future for us all, a plan that needs to be carefully put together and worked through; a plan that will give to us all hope, and vision, and peace in our hearts.<sub>3</sub> The plan took many hundreds of years for the right moment for Jesus to come. A plan that was considered by the Trinity of God in agreement between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This plan was not put together for God and His future, but for our future, your future, my future; so that God could enjoy our presence around the table with Him and fellowship with us once again. God's plan was eagerly anticipated by the heavenly host – they all knew what was about to happen. As Jesus is born in the stable so the heavenly host shout and sing and burst with the excitement of God's gift to us – Jesus unwrapped, given to everyone, and we share in the joy of the Father as Jesus takes His place in the world – God incarnate.

As you wrap some gifts, order the food and drink, put up the decorations and make plans for a perfect day, think on the plans that God made – the plans that He took His time in perfecting – the plans that would pay the ransom needed to free us, the plans that neutralised the power of the enemy over us. The perfect plan.... with the perfect gift.... on a perfect day.

We welcome once again the story of Jesus and how He came to us to give to us that gift of freedom from guilt and shame: a gift of love from the Father, the gift of belonging to a family, the gift of life!

# Southminster Community Hub Update



The Management Committee of representatives of the United Reformed Church and St. Leonard's Church, who are working in partnership, meet monthly in the URC Church Building to discuss and update on the expansion of the use of the building for a Community Hub to become a resource centre to serve the needs of the Dengie Peninsula.

A Community development worker has now been appointed to help the project develop and it is good to have Karis Galliano on board with her wealth of experience and local connections.

Work goes on in setting up the policies and procedures for the legal aspects needed to be covered for the Hub and funding/ grant sources discussed.

We recognise that Citizens Advice on a Tuesday and the Food Pantry on a Wednesday have been regularly coming to the URC Church and it is hoped in the future to have more organisations come in. We had an update on the numbers of people being referred and benefitting from the Food Pantry which is now 100+ (this figure incorporates families). The Food Pantry is helped so much by some local food outlets for which they are very grateful.

The renovations and costings for the hub are ongoing and it is hoped that the work will start in earnest by next March.

# **Re-Gifting**

Be honest, have you ever re-gifted an unwanted present given to you? It's almost Christmas and it's often a struggle to know what to buy as a gift for someone isn't it, but should it be a struggle? Do we want to stop buying gifts but don't know how to approach the subject and worry that we'll look mean?

Often, we give monetary gifts so the recipient chooses their own gift, but how much do we give as things get more expensive year after year? How often do we receive a gift we don't like or need? Do we regift it and hope the giver doesn't find out or we accidently give them back their gift to us? Does Christmas a time of joy and celebration, get spoiled by not receiving the gift you longed for?

It is said that our gift giving goes back to the time when the Wise Men took gifts to the Christ Child, gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh, all gifts with a special meaning. Gold being symbolic of Christ the King, His kingship on earth; Frankincense was used for worship in the temple, symbolic of Christ the High Priest; Myrrh, was an anointing perfume for someone who had died, symbolic of the death of Jesus for the sake of truth. The wise men gave gifts with such meaning, thoughtful gifts, gifts lovingly received.

Or perhaps was gift giving a pagan custom? Also, where did Father Christmas (or Santa Claus) originate from? It was believed that Saint Nicholas, was a Christian Bishop who helped the needy and the legend of his gift giving ministry grew. It is said that he transformed into the legendary character called Santa Claus.

One thing we do know is that the most precious gift any person can receive is the gift we read of in Acts 2: 38 - 39 which says: "Repent and be baptized every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit". The Holy Spirit in turn brings gifts to help us lead others to Jesus. We think especially of the gift of love which we receive for ourselves, the gift that keeps on coming and overflows in us, so we can in turn re-gift it

Let's remember this Christmas that Jesus is the reason for the Season and accept His wonderful gift of salvation and the promise of eternal life with Him. What better gift can we ask for.
