Vicar's Reflection for November

"As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night will never cease." Genesis 8:22

During the past month we have enjoyed two wonderful Harvest celebrations. Thank you to all who organised, shopped, cooked, provided, set up and cleared up at the Supper in the Barn and the lunch in church. They were great times to be together and to enjoy fellowship as we share lovely food together.

As we came into the churches, we saw an abundance of produce, colour and a variety of different things that have been donated and given to God. The sight and smell made a feeling of wellbeing and peace.

St. Francis of Assisi wrote some words that later became a song for us that contained the words "it is in giving that we receive" and that wellbeing and peace is what we receive from God, as we give to Him.

We have had, over these past two months, a mini series entitled Generous God – Generous Disciples where we have discovered the abundance of God that is given to us daily and for which we thank Him. Out of the abundance that God gives to us do we give to Him, and we have learnt through this series that as we are moulded into the likeness of God, so we become like Him in every aspect. The generosity of God has

held no bounds, for He has not withheld anything from us but pours out to us in His goodness.

On our Sunday mornings we saw how much God had provided for His people through the Old Testament and into the New. The provision of a Ram when Abraham took his son to the mountain to sacrifice to God. The provision of Manna in the desert for the Israelites, not just occasionally but everyday (except the Sabbath!). The amazing provision of Quail in the desert – again, six days a week; the incredible abundance of fish caught in the net when the fishermen had caught none.

This is the generosity of God who provides when there is nothing! As we worshipped together, we heard testimonies of how God had met needs in a miraculous way and the gratitude in the fact that He gives. I wonder how many times each of you has experienced a provision in your life that was unexpected – an answer to prayer in a desperate time, and how God came through and answered. Our God is a faithful God, as the saying goes 'God doesn't come when we expect Him to come; but He is always right on time!'

In the same trust, we give to God in our time, talent, goods and money. We give in the knowledge that He first gave to us and we give back to Him out of the abundance that He has poured out to us. Our giving is in joy as we realise how much God has given to us.

Harvest is an ideal example of God's abundant provision – we pray that God will continue to bless the work of our hands, and the hands of all those who provide and gather our food.

May we be as faithful as our God is to us. Amen.

How good a swimmer are you? I'm certainly not a swimmer. I find it a struggle to move a few feet in the water and, getting down into a swimming pool now is nigh on impossible!

As opposed to a swimming pool it can often take much more effort to swim in the sea especially when having to swim against the tide. I always look in amazement at the example of salmon born in freshwater. The salmon then go to spend most of their lives in the ocean and then swim upstream and return to the place of fresh water they were born in to lay their eggs to reproduce. Often a very long, real uphill struggle with I'm sure



many casualties along the way.

As Christians we, especially in the tough times, constantly need to praise God from whom all blessings flow. Just as blood flows through our bodies to keep us healthy so we need to guard our heart for everything we do flows from it. (Proverbs 4:23) We need to let go of worldly distractions and fill our hearts and minds with Godly things and to often push against the tide of popular belief.

Jesus often 'swam against the tide' as his teachings and lifestyle went against the cultural norms and religious expectations of his time. We, too, have to swim against the tide at times. The amazing thing is that we know that as believers the Holy Spirit within us is the living water which

flows through us and refreshes us (John 7:39). Let's remember when we may be feeling really low in spirit that Jesus says "Come to me you who are weary and burdened and I will give you rest." One thing we do know is that with our hearts



safely in His hands our lives will always flow in the right direction.
