August Reflection by Ken Dunstan

Back in the 1970s, the then Vicar asked me to attempt a guide to the church. The first effort expanded to include some of the history of Southminster with a section called, "A Walk Round the Church".

Many church guides are just that. They just describe the building, as one critic observed, "up to the last restoration." Architecture and architectural heritage matter. When, in the early years of this century, we considered removing the pews in favour of chairs, we were told, "You'll have to consult the Victorian Society." My 1966 AA Book of the Road describes Southminster as, "pop. 1897, M.D. Tues. The restored Church has a good 15th Cent. north porch. Pieces of furniture from Nelson's 'Victory' are preserved." Holiday visitors beware!

The church is far more than a "restored" building, and the pieces of furniture never were on the Victory. A later Vicar, David Lumb and his wife Mary visited HMS Victory and asked. They were told that nothing was removed from the ship, and in any case, there was too little room for what I thought was a chart table. The legend still lives on in some guide books, no doubt, but we have to live with the truth. And the truth is far more helpful and wonderful.

I have served as a licensed priest in nine different parish churches, besides a further dozen as a visiting minister in the absence of an incumbent. Of those nine, six were on the edge of, or away from, the settlement they served. Settlements move. When my last parish, Mayland, moved, the church was marooned $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the new population centre. Southminster is blessed with a church that is walking distance from most homes of the village. That gives us opportunities to serve the parish that many others aren't able to enjoy.

Southminster's building demonstrates nine centuries of architectural change. Much of that change is due to three men – Tudor, Georgian and Victorian. Each had a particular vision of what a church is for. The Victorian, William Lowder, wanted a church suitable for Anglo-Catholic ceremony. The 21st Century has seen changes to make worship more accessible while enabling faith to grow.

Although architecture matters, a lot, what matters most is purpose. Southminster Parish Church sits right at the centre of the village to proclaim, as we hear in the Communion service, "The Lord is here! His Spirit is with us!" That's why the revised Guide tries to remind visitors and residents alike that the building is a place of worship, a place of learning and growth in discipleship, and a base for telling others the really good news of God's love and His purposes for the world.

The truth I mentioned earlier continues to be wonderful. Of Southminster's three churches in 1965, one, the Baptist Chapel, is now a private home. Southminster Congregational Church became part of the United Reformed Church in the 1970s with the title Christ Church. It had losses leading to the end of regular worship there a few years ago. Parish Church and URC relationships have varied, but for much of the time each has seen the other as a potential partner. That partnership has recently become closer. A formal agreement between the two to work together will use Christ Church's facilities as a Community Hub while Sunday worship is based mainly at the Parish Church. A packed Christ Church saw the signing of this agreement by Canon Peter and the Rev. Anne Sardeson, ready to be counter-signed by the Moderator of the URC East of England Synod and Archdeacon Jonathan.

Yes, buildings matter, though not just because of their design, or renovation or their content. All carry a message, like that of a palace trumpeting power and privilege, or a mansion advertising wealth. Our two buildings already house the Dengie Food Pantry and Citizens' Advice. There's more to develop. Pray for the Hub, for the two buildings, for the people who worship in them, the people they serve and for the message of God's love they carry.

Above Reproach?

The Bible talks to us in I Corinthians I2 and I3 about the Spiritual gifts our Lord gives us especially saying that love undergirds everything. We read that Love is patient, love is kind, it does not envy, it does not boast, it does not dishonour others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered. Also, we must never think of ourselves more highly than we ought (Romans I2 v 3-8). We may go around thinking how good we would be in a testing situation until we are in one! Then our carnal self be it in thought or deed often takes over!

I had such a test recently. I took my husband to a Bowls Club in Danbury. As I dropped him off in the car park a car with an elderly man driving came in front of me and insisted by facial and hand gestures that I move out of his way. I had no room to manoeuvre and he eventually got round me. I went to drive off



only for him to have circled the car park and come round in front of me again even more angry looking than before. From the safety of my car, I mouthed at him twice "Don't be so grumpy "but to no avail and he stayed put! I then remembered a real word of wisdom my driving instructor told me many years ago, she said if a male driver gets aggressive just blow him a kiss and drive off, so this is what I did! The grumpy man's face was a picture!!

I have to admit it crossed my mind (fleetingly!) to retaliate and say or do something I would later regret but my instructor's words saved the day! How much more will my heavenly Father's instructions save the day. Jesus himself in very testing situations often said nothing and advised his disciples to walk away at times from situations.

The Bible says: "Test me and see if there is any offensive way in me. (Psalm 139:23-24). Testing times are necessary in our Christian walk to see how we are maturing and how we react and cope in any given situation. It is, often in ongoing situations, that our patience wears thin and frustration and angry words are said. Jesus was so unjustly treated and wounded but we know that even from the cruelty of the cross he forgave.

Our main aim in our Christian walk is to become more like Jesus and bless people rather than curse them. I didn't immediately bless the grumpy man or forgive him but thankfully I didn't to Blessing side of it all and I found out later that God had blessed the grumpy man anyway as his bowls team won their match which I really hope he enjoyed!!

Eco Tip of the Month from A Rocha: August

Assist local wildlife during very hot weather. Provide hedgehogs with hedgehog biscuits (available at many pet stores and online) or dog biscuits (small/crumbed) as their prey of slugs, snails and worms diminishes, and ensure a safe exit for them and other small mammals if you have a garden pond. Help garden birds by maintaining a filled bird bath and supplying supplementary food including black sunflower seeds, pinhead oatmeal, soaked sultanas, raisins, currants, mealworms, waxworms, and a nutritious seed mixture, when natural supplies become scarce.

PCC Jottings

At our PCC (Parochial Church Council) meeting in July it was mentioned that it might be helpful to let the church know some of the ongoing items on the agenda that are discussed at our bi-monthly



meetings. Our agendas are often similar each time as we receive updates on ongoing works on the fabric of the building and reports from the various teams which the PCC is divided into.

We are happy to report the start of the maintenance on the parts of the church ceiling which were damaged by water and the renewal of the crumbling plaster in places. When this work is complete the back of the church will be able to be used in a much more productive way.

The Vicar's vestry has been re-carpeted and many thanks to the generous person who donated the carpet and carried out the work for no fee.

We gave thanks to Rev. Jacqui, her husband and others, who had a Labyrinth cut into the church grounds behind the church which has been walked by many of the congregation and the school children too. It will be kept cut and hopefully used for personal meditation for all until at least the Autumn.

Some of the trees in the churchyard have been pollarded and one removed through disease. Our thanks were also again given to the Community Payback team and other volunteers for keeping the churchyard grounds tidy.

Ongoing updates on the Community Hub being set up in the URC church building in North Street are given at each meeting. St. Leonard's and the URC now have a joint management committee overseeing the work done and we look forward to the time when the hub is fully up and running with different organisations coming in to help people with various needs. The Citizen's Advice on a Tuesday and the Food Pantry on a Wednesday have been in situ in the URC church for a long time now which has been a great asset to this local area.

This year's Holiday club will be from $20^{th} - 22^{nd}$ August and preparations start very early in the year for the very willing volunteers. Other Children's activities occur during the year and Little Lions is an invaluable mother and toddler group held in the Memorial Hall during school term time on a Wednesday morning.

At each PCC meeting a treasurer's report is given and updates on training necessary for PCC members and all those working in a specific role in the church. Any reported concerns from Church members or from the village are discussed and acted on appropriately. The church needs a new Safeguarding Officer at present and a PCC secretary to take minutes and help with administration support. If anyone feels prompted to help, please speak to Rev. Peter or Rev. Jacqui.

Please remember that the PCC is here to serve the Church and the Parish and will always be available to listen and help if needed.
