

Curate's Reflection

Join the Song

As we already know, Advent, in the Church calendar, is the time when we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus at Christmas. The word advent originates from the Latin adventus, which means coming because we remember when Jesus came and when people first came into God's presence, born as a child in a manger.

Singing plays a huge part in our Christmas preparations, but the account in our Bibles, in the book of Luke, reminds us that music was also significant at the time of Jesus' birth. When Mary was pregnant, her cousin Elizabeth sang, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear!" Mary responds to Elizabeth in the song we call the Magnificat (often used in evening prayer), "My soul magnifies the Lord" is the first line. Then we hear how the shepherds were overwhelmed when the night sky filled with a great company of angels singing God's praise, "Glory to God in the highest." And, after meeting Jesus, the shepherds returned, praising God for all they had heard and seen.

All these years later, singing is still central to how we prepare for Christmas Day. Our young people learn and sing Christmas carols that the old among us often know by heart. This year, the Church of England has developed a range of resources to help choirs, singing groups, schools and churches 'join the song' during Advent. A new composition of the First Nowell has even been commissioned from a world-renowned composer, Bob

Chilcott, and I'm sure we'll play the music video in church this month.

However, something in the past year may make you reluctant to or not feel like joining in the singing. The thought of preparations for Christmas may make you sad, uninterested, or lonely. This year, remembering may be about stitching together something that has been severed, a feeling of separation from others, so it may be hard to join in the chorus. However, the season of Advent, the coming of lesus Christ, is a time of preparing not just for Christmas Day but for three things: celebrating the birth of lesus in Bethlehem, receiving lesus into our hearts and believing that our destiny is to come; to live with the holy choir of heavenly angels in God's eternal Kingdom. Unlike Santa Claus, Jesus doesn't just travel from house to house, leaving gifts on one day each year; Jesus dwells in each home and is the one who fills the empty chair(s) at our tables, comforting us and helping us to face all that is to come each and every day.

As we remember and prepare for Christmas, may the peace of Jesus dwell in your hearts, and may we all sing our way through Advent, as was done in biblical times, believing that God came in the form of a baby and was named Jesus – the one who will cradle us as our lips sing of our love for all that Jesus did and will continue to do for us in the year ahead and into eternity.

PCC Jottings

WELCOME BISHOP ADAM

It was good to be able to attend, on Saturday 4th November, the special Welcome and licensing service at Chelmsford Cathedral for the Right Reverend Adam Atkinson as Bishop of Bradwell. The Reverends Jonathan Croucher, as Archdeacon of Chelmsford, and

Kate Peacock as Archdeacon of Stansted were also welcomed and collated. We particularly enjoyed Bishop Adam's sermon, so we will share some memories of what he said.

Focus on cooking: particularly today Lamb Stew. Jesus is often described as eating and drinking with people and we are called to follow Him. So, note the regular hospitality in the Chelmsford diocese. Check the seating arrangements, being aware that those who exalt themselves will be punished but those who humble themselves will be exalted. (Luke 14: 7 - 11) Perhaps this isn't good advice in Sport and Business, but it is good news for Jesus' followers. Blessed are the poor in Spirit.

Leadership is functional, not hierarchical. We're here to love you and serve you. We will be bringing the good news of Jesus. There is nothing you can do to make Him love you. Just humble yourself, receive the good news and live your life. There is a hope we can cling to. There is joy in the morning. People at the bottom will be exalted.

Think of the chef in the kitchen. There are bad times and amazing times. He is a pauper in spirit. He surrenders (still cooking but praying too). Thinking again about the lamb stew, we can focus on the Lamb slain from the beginning in Revelation. The point of the Lamb Stew is that Jesus is the Lamb slain for us, but mercifully, risen to rule.

We're all invited to receive God's hospitality, so let's join Jesus in the feast. It's free! Hospitality is expensive, but in Jesus, the host has already paid the price.

Right now he is completing the final touches: Introduction, cover, etc. It is a complete Bible, and as the script cannot be small, it will end up like the big Bible of around 2000 pages! 9 inches tall! There is a well established network of churches in South Sudan, and this is a much anticipated revision of the New Testament, along with a brand new translation of the old Testament. It has been done under the auspices of the Episcopal Church of South Sudan, and will be widely used by a number of different dialect groups making up the wider Dinka language community.
