Vicar's Reflection for February 2025

Missed opportunities? Colossians 4: 5 'Make the most of every opportunity'

At a recent school assembly, we were looking at the life of young Jesus, beginning with His presentation in the temple when he was eight days old. There wasn't much that Jesus could do at that time as He was too young, yet His parents made the decision to bring him up as part of the family of the church (temple) and by making regular visits there. Jesus would have been taught at home too as Joseph and Mary nurtured and taught him; and of course, all those relatives round and about them would have their input into His life. The next time that we read about Jesus' life was when He was 12 years old and in the temple for celebration again; this time being left behind for three days.

We read that Jesus was taking an opportunity to sit in the temple courts debating and asking questions of the teachers. It says in Luke 2: 47 "and all who heard Him were amazed at His understanding and His answers" Clearly, Jesus had been a good student and by the time He was I2 He had great understanding and interpretation of the scriptures, or Old Testament as we would describe. Fiona and I have known a lot of I2-year-olds over the years, from teaching II – I4-year-olds at a previous church and in the work we have done with schools and other churches; but we have not come across one that is well versed in the scripture; old or new testament. However, I had been encouraged during this past year when asked to chair a discussion in the local school, that the year 6 students (4th year junior in old money!) had really good insight

into the bible and asked some amazing questions. As we (Rev'd. Jacqui and I) spoke on atonement and forgiveness; topics that are quite mature in Christian terms, and thoughts ideas from the young people were voiced that were quite amazing. How good, we thought, that these young people have a grasp of theology that maybe their parents did not.

We are blessed within the benefice of Southminster to have people who are able to speak to us in different ways on a Sunday Morning; some teach, others preach, some give contextual example, some give scriptural background, some historical; all of which broaden our understanding of scripture and of God and His kingdom. We all learn from different perspectives and we are blessed to have a diversity of people to enable our understanding of God's intentions for us.

The hour that Jacqui and I spent in the classroom speaking with the students encouraged our hearts as we sought to find the reason for our faith and the meaning of our vocation. One hour out of 168 hours in a week, and in that time, God encouraged the hearts of nearly 35 people; God fed us enough to be uplifted and excited about our faith.

There is so much more to learn; there is no end to what God wants to teach us and how He wants to feed us. Perhaps we need to spend a concentrated hour with God, with His word, that we might be uplifted from the routines of the day and maybe see things in a new light.

Maybe meeting with others, chatting about our faith, chewing over the scriptures may be the way we spend the hour. There are Homegroups/Bible study groups, Alpha course/ Children's

work/ church work that can fulfil our meeting together in a way that enables us to speak about our faith, journey and grow together.

Let's make the most of the opportunities that we have, to bless others and to grow in our faith and encourage others. Let us "be amazed" as God meets with us.

It's so frustrating isn't it when you come to the end of a jigsaw and there's one piece missing! I know from experience that so much time is spent looking for that one piece to finish a certain section of the puzzle and it's not there!

Jigsaws can become quite addictive can't they! At Chatterbox on Thursday mornings a group of people can be

seen beavering away at a shared jigsaw with such concentration that not much chatter is to be heard! I am impressed at the way that tasks are shared, with one person sorting out the blue-sky pieces into a small tub and



another person sorting different colours to make life easier! A really shared task and it's often difficult to prise them away to pack up and go home!

As with all jigsaws there are often areas that aren't so appealing like the vast expanses of sky or grass and frustration can set in but if we persevere it becomes all worthwhile.

As I was pondering on the jigsaw and how all the parts fit together it struck me how one- piece missing can make it feel incomplete. Equating this to our Christian lives, we are part of God's great jigsaw, each piece with a part to play, fitting in to the pattern of life God has mapped out for us.

As part of the Body of Christ, we need each other as it tells us in I Corinthians I2. We may think we aren't very important or don't play as big a part as others seem to and

we can get by with some parts of the body not functioning so well, but how lovely it is when everything works together in harmony and all the pieces of the body fit together and become complete.

So, how do we fit in to God's jigsaw? How do we fit in to the Body of Christ here in St. Leonard's? Perhaps we could be an edge piece holding it all together, or a piece of bright colour standing out and very visible, or we can blend in to the sea or sky. No one piece more important than the other, all pieces fitting together to create the complete picture.

Are there any pieces missing in our Church family? Any tasks or ministries our Lord wants to enhance and are we open to filling that vital space that God is encouraging us to fit into. Let's seek Him and attempt to fill any empty spaces this

Prayer Ministry on Sundays after the 11 am service

Please come to the area outside the Chapel if you have a particular need for prayer, (for yourself or someone close to you) where there should be two people available to pray with you. Pre-service prayer occurs too, so feel free to join them with your supporting prayers or your urgent requests.

2025 HACKBLOCK SERVICE

This annual service remembers the Father and Son. John and Peter Hackblock who were Southminster's doctors in the late 18th and early 19th centuries. Their wills left land to the church, including a proviso that on the Sunday nearest to Peter's birthday, 17th January, a service should be held during which the preacher would receive one shilling (12 old pence), and a quartern loaf (See picture on cover of this magazine.) would be provided for the poor of Southminster. The land concerned was sold for the building of the Tattersall's estate near the station. The money following their wishes was used to create the Hackblock Education Charity which was set up in 1991 in memory of the two men. . The main objective of the charity is to provide funds to support the educational needs of young people up to the age of 25 living in the parish of Southminster and adjoining parishes. This can include financial support for St Leonard's Primary School. Grants may also be allocated to individuals or other bodies after an application to the trustees in accordance with the Trust's criteria

Many of our young people have benefited and several, including group leaders, gave their testimonies as presentations during the service to explain their situation. These included:

Jenny - for Holiday Club Val - for Girl Guides

Rachel - for Brownies and Rainbows

Wendy - for St Leonard's School

Dawn - for School Prayer Stations

Karen - for Little Lions and Saturday Club

Dawn - for her daughter Aria's assistance Lucy - for St Nicholas School, Tillingham

All these testimonies were greatly appreciated and then our visiting preacher, Rev'd Carrie Prior, was welcomed. She is the Chelmsford Diocese Director of Education. She began by saying "It is a privilege to be here and to celebrate the work of the Church School, of the other groups and clubs and individuals, and of course as part of this service we rightly give thanks for the shared commitment of the children, the teachers, the staff, the volunteers, the parents and the wider community who all contribute to the learning and growth. Together we play a vital role in nurturing gifts, creating opportunities and providing environments where children and learners of all ages can flourish."

Carrie's sermon was based on 1 Corinthians 12 1-11 and John 2 1 - 11. Paul's letter reminds us that every person has a unique gift to contribute, and all gifts come from God. They are used to build up the body of the Church for community benefit. Our work in schools or in groups, with children and young people is the work of the Spirit. We are nurturing the whole person - the mind, body and soul. Every contribution, no matter how small, matters when guided by love and service. John's story of Jesus turning water into wine at a wedding, shows us how a simple act of obedience (the servants did what Jesus told them) can remind us that transformation takes place when we offer the most ordinary things - our time, our effort and our talents into the hands of Christ.

Steeple Church News

Steeple Church has services every Sunday morning at 9.15am unless otherwise advertised on the church door. We have Morning Prayer on the first Sunday each month, a Family Service on third Sunday and Holy Communion on the second and fourth Sundays. The Parochial Church Council and worshippers at Steeple Church are immensely grateful for the services of many volunteers who help keep our 140 years old church and its graveyard in reasonably good repair. One has been painstakingly restoring some mosaic tiling in the Chancel floor. Another, cuts the hedge and yet others mow areas of the churchyard. Last year, one former Steeple resident renewed the oak railings around the area of the churchyard set aside for cremated remains.

During this year we hope to repair the guttering and improve the rainwater disposal on the South side of the building. Our hardworking volunteers will need support from outside contractors for some parts of this project, affordable thanks to the generosity of everyone who supports our fund-raising activities.

Please note in your diary that the first of these, Wheels, Hooves and Paws at Elmwood Equestrian, Burnham-on-Crouch, will be on Saturday 12th July this year.
