Vicar's Reflection

We have been thrilled to see in the Vicarage garden a vast number of birds and their young visiting the seed feeders and fat ball peckers. It seems that we are needing to nip out and top up the feeders twice a day at least, and we could fill up the fat balls three times a day! They also seem to really appreciate the home-made bird 'flapjack' we make for them: they hit that first every time! Even so, it is really lovely to watch them and we're amazed at the lovely variety which grace us with their visits: it is so worthwhile feeding them good 'food' knowing it is for their thriving.

We have seen a lot of blackbirds, blue tits, great tits and goldfinches this year, along with a thrush, robins, greenfinches and a woodpecker plus the occasional jay: a real show of colour and joy.

I am sure that as you have travelled you have seen the young lambs growing or the calves moving through the fields. You may have seen the ears of the barley or the sheen of the Lucerne (a lovely blue) as the crops mature in the sunlight.

The true beauty of late spring can be the deepening green hues of the roadside shrubs and trees, contrasted against clear blue skies and it all adds up to make us realise that new things are happening around us even when we don't think that there will be any longer evenings or warmth in the sun... yet.

My father-in-law used to say that he had his 'mental video' going as we journeyed through valleys on holiday; these are the 'videos' that he would recall when drifting off to sleep or when, on a cold winter night, remembering that new seasons will soon approach, when we can all enjoy better times or even holiday once again!

Looking at past holiday photographs helps on gloomy days, to lift our spirits and bring to mind our family and friends, places visited and journeys made; maybe even the comments that have been said to us on special occasions that have given to us great encouragement. What lovely thoughts and images to have stored in our minds to draw upon when things are hard. It helps us to focus on the good rather than the current situations, it re-assures us that in time, the situation will change and our hearts are filled, and fuelled, with hope, joy and love. Remembering occasions and words are so important to us, helping us to put things into perspective and realise the important things in life, like close friends and family. The love that we have for them is stronger than any situation or trouble: that love fuels us for the coming days.

The letter to the Ephesian church (chapter 2) tells us of the great love that God has for us, and has given to us in order to make us 'alive' again, ready for anything because of the grace that He has given to us. In the book of Psalms God remembers us and the covenant that he has made: "For their sake He remembered His covenant and showed compassion according to the abundance of His steadfast love". (Ps. 106:45).

It doesn't take very long for us to see a situation, or something familiar, that spurs a thought onto something, or someone that we love. God **continually** thinks of us, the intercessions of Jesus are **always** for those whom the Father loves, as we remember Jesus, He remembers us before the throne of God, because He loves us. It well behoves us to practice our 'remembering 'of verses for our own building-up of faith, to sustain us in more difficult times, and to share readily with others for their encouragement. Often in the Bible we are encouraged to really set about 'remembering' what God has *already* done of His people, for **us**.

> "Whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, **think about these things**". (Philippians 4:8) and think about them often.

As a belated birthday present my sister booked us tickets to see a ballet at the Civic Theatre in Chelmsford which was based on the stories of Beatrix Potter. beautiful production and the children, and ourselves, were mesmerised by the wonderful costumes of the Beatrix Potter's characters, my favourites being Jeremy Fisher and Jemima Puddle-Duck! One little girl entertained us during the interval by practising her ballet steps up and down the aisle, I was tempted to join her!!



One of my ambitions as a child was to be a ballet dancer and I used to stand on my toes and dance around but alas never fulfilled my dream! Isn't it great today that there is so much for children to do even in our own home town! It can be difficult in these times of austerity but we need to encourage them in to the things that are affordable.

It is a lovely sight to see children enjoying themselves and we know that Jesus Himself encouraged children and loved to bless them.We read in Mark 10 v 13-16 that people were bringing little children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them but the disciples rebuked them.When Jesus saw this, he was indignant. He said to them "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them for the Kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Truly I tell you anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it." He then took the children in his arms and blessed them. Jesus, is here, challenging first century ideas of social status where children had no status and would be unwelcome in many contexts. Just as we sit and enjoy watching shows and many forms of entertainment, we most importantly as Christians need to come to Jesus, to sit at his feet and be mesmerised by his teachings. We come to learn, to grow up in the Christian faith. Hebrews 5 v 11-14 tells us that we need to mature in our faith, starting off as children with milk and then maturing on to solid food, digesting the Word of God.

It's never too late to turn to Jesus as our Lord and Saviour. We may have many regrets and lost opportunities and perhaps lost childhoods through difficult circumstances or not having been

able to fulfil our dreams. We sing "Jesus take me as I am, I can come no other way". We come as little children, eager to learn. The joy of knowing Jesus is more than enough for me and one thing I know that although I will never be a ballet dancer in this world but when I get to heaven who knows!!!!

Steeple Church News

Steeple Church has services every Sunday morning at 9.15am unless otherwise advertised on the church door. We have Morning Prayer on the first and third Sundays each month and Holv Communion on the second and fourth.

The Steeple Church belfry timber renovation project has moved another step forward. The Diocesan Advisory Committee (DAC) members didn't raise any gueries when they reviewed our faculty application package on 19th April. For the month of May, there's been a public consultation advertised in the notice board outside the church inviting anyone wishing to object to the planned repairs to write to the Diocesan Registrar at Chelmsford before 2nd June.

Assuming no such objections, we'll get the formal go ahead around the end of June but it will be conditional on making sure that the bats that almost certainly roost in and around the building will not be adversely affected by the repairs. A representative from the Bat Conservation Trust is making an initial assessment of the whole building during May but only from ground level. The definitive evaluation will occur once the scaffolding has been erected. Our chosen contractor, Bakers of Danbury, is aware that our Faculty Application is on schedule and expects to get our work completed during the third quarter of this year, hopefully before the weather deteriorates. That means we have just four months to complete our funding plan by securing grants from organizations committed to preserving listed rural churches and from money we hope to raise through our summer fund raising activities.

The organiser for stalls is Peter Ingram who can be contacted by text message to 07854 217 941. It's essential for stall holders to book in advance so that we can allocate appropriate space on the field layout.

As well as the usual wide selection of vehicles plus stationary engines driving various bits of farming memorabilia, we will of course have excellent refreshments.
