Curate's Reflection

At the beginning of the year, I was officially 'signed off' from my Curacy by Bishop Adam of Bradwell. This means I've been given permission to seek a clergy vacancy in the Church of England, or, more commonly known as 'looking for my own parish!' Realising that I'm on the move again isn't easy, as it means I won't be here to see the exciting things God is doing in the Southminster & Steeple Benefice.

For clergy, the moving-on process is about discernment. This means listening to God, waiting on God to prompt us, and trusting that God will guide us to a place that is just right (Psalm 139:16 - "in your book were written all the days that were formed for me"). So, when people ask, "What do you want?" my reply is, "I'd prefer to stay in the Chelmsford Diocese, but I'm open to where God calls me next." I must trust that God will lead me to the right place for my gifts, character and experience, just as happened when I came to The Dengie.

During my time here, I've witnessed God at work, pointing people out, drawing people into the church family, using people's gifts and encouraging people to step out in faith. The development of the Southminster Community Hub is one example of God bringing multiple agencies together to serve and support our community in partnership with Christ Church United Reformed Church. If you are interested in getting involved or feel God stirring you to do so, our next meeting is at lunchtime on Monday I Ith March so do pop in. Another example is the development of prayer spaces in each classroom in Southminster Primary School. God has raised up a team of creative people to lead and continue this important ministry with children and staff in school. There are numerous other examples of God using people and inspiring them to organise,

administer, lead, serve and love our community. The evidence confirms that God is calling people and equipping us to be the hands and feet of Jesus in our villages.

We are now part way into Lent, the time of preparation for Easter when we draw close to God, give up things that disrupt the equilibrium, rid ourselves of bad habits, and spend quality time with God to discern what God's plan is for us in the future.

In John 1: 38, Jesus asked the fishermen who were following him, "What do you want?" They were taken aback and they fumbled a reply asking Jesus where he was staying. Jesus' response was, "Come, and you will see." God had predetermined a path for those fishermen because as they spent time with Jesus, they discovered he was someone they could relate to. God executed his perfect plan as these fishermen became the first disciples.

So, my answer to the question, "What do you want?" is to be sent to a community of people that I can relate to and them me – a perfect match for this next season of my ministry. To somewhere I can invite people to 'come and see' for themselves how God will lovingly transform their lives.

But, my question is, "What do you want?" I invite you to dwell with God, ponder, be vulnerable and notice any thoughts that stir, excitement that arises and clarity that may come about the future. Prayerfully ask by the power of the Holy Spirit for God to reveal what and where God may be leading you in this next season. Let this question penetrate your prayer times for the rest of Lent. God may have a plan for you - be open to what God reveals. (See Jeremiah 29:11)

Even if you are unable to attend services regularly because of Sunday commitments, your willingness to be part of the team in some way will be welcomed and appreciated.

Earth Hour 8.30pm to 9.30pm 23rd March 2024.

Since 2007, individuals from around the globe have switched off their lights during Earth Hour to show symbolic support for the planet and to raise awareness of the environmental issues affecting it.

This year, Earth Hour falls on the Saturday before Palm Sunday, so please set a reminder or note the date and time in your diary and switch off your lights to help save the planet.

This year's **BISHOP'S LENT APPEAL** will be supporting the Diocese of Jerusalem's Healthcare Ministry. This diocese is home to about 7,000 Anglicans worshipping in 28 congregations across five different countries or territories: Jordan, Palestine, Lebanon, Syria and Israel. Inspired by the parable of the Good Samaritan, the ministry of healthcare offers help to those in need regardless of race, religion, or ability to pay. Its institutions range from homes for the elderly to therapeutic residential facilities for special needs students, to clinics, rehabilitation centres and hospitals. The need for support is particularly pressing at this time of war in the Holy Land.

Steeple Church is thankful for having a high proportion of "under 16s" in its congregation. This sometimes approaches 50% which is very unusual, particularly when remembering that our regular services start at 9.15am.

Before work started on the belfry timber renovation project in 2022 we removed the wrought iron gates at the church entrance to avoid them getting damaged during the building works. These gates have historical significance because they were installed just after the end of WW2 as a thanksgiving for the return of peace. After exposure to 75 years of rain and road spray they were overdue for refurbishment. That work is now underway and we hope to have the gates back in position in time for Easter.
