NEWS FOR THE WORLD

On Easter Monday it was announced by the Vatican Pope Francis has died at 7.30 am today, aged 88.

He had continued in his papal role despite recent health problems and he had even presided at the Easter Sunday Service (with support from colleagues).

He will be remembered for his regular promotion of Christian life being based on fidelity, courage and universal love, especially for the poorest and most marginalised people. As the Archbishop of York (formerly Bishop of Chelmsford) said in his response: "These universal Christian values are shared by the Church of England."

INVESTING 2025

What is the first thought or word that comes to most of us when we see or hear the word Investing. It probably is money. We are constantly reminded of new investment ideas or saving plans which give us updated rates of interest, a good return.

It's good to invest our money in a sensible way if we are able to, but how much do we invest in people? Do we only invest in those people from which we get a good return?



Just as there are many differing ways of investing, be it in monetary terms or in jewellery or precious metals, there are also many different ways of investing in people it could be:

Professional development - aiding growth within a company

Job role and leadership – encouraging obvious skills Physical health – caring, coming alongside. Spiritual growth – teaching and discipling

Personal goals – helping people attain their dreams.

We, as a church, periodically run Alpha Courses which always start with a meal giving people time to chat and relax and get to know each other better before a time of learning. A time to invest in learning more about our faith.

2 Thess v 7-12 tells us that Paul, Silas and Timothy and his companions lived and worked among the Thessalonians, sharing their lives with them, not trying to please people but to please God by their examples. They invested time, energy and love whilst preaching the Gospel to them.

So how long do we invest our time with people? It is not a fixed time process it depends on the nature of the relationship

and their goals. But it must be done with genuine care and compassion for the duration of the relationship and with a view to helping people to be more independent and have more control and to attain a greater goal in their lives.



Whilst investing our lives to help others we shouldn't expect anything in return as we would expect a return from monetary investments, but one thing for sure it is always so rewarding when a new, long-lasting friendship is formed which is worth everything!

Travelling well? Ken Dunstan

Bishop Guli gave us a challenge once she had explored the diocese and taken our collective temperature. She didn't intend imposing a "top-down" policy with specified activities. Rather, we should learn to "travel well together" with local initiatives getting Diocesan support.

She recognises that the journey is part of our faith. Jesus worked on the move and the early church, certainly through St Paul, who travelled tirelessly sharing the Gospel.

We echoed this on Good Friday as we carried a cross in procession from Christ Church to the Parish Church as a reminder to Southminster of the killing of Jesus.

Others travel because they have to. They may be fleeing flood or drought; they may be, and increasingly are, fleeing persecution or the

violence of war. They seek the basics of living and seek safety. Who wouldn't?

However, some politicians see gain in using these people as scapegoats. Margaret Thatcher once spoke of our being "swamped" by immigrants. Donald Trump has

described their coming as an "invasion." It's true that many cross the channel in inadequate small boats, overcrowded by the criminals who have charged extortionate fees, at risk of dying in Europe's busiest shipping lane. Why do they come? Why are Britain's leaders so hostile to them? The United Nations High Commission for Refugees, which I support, sent me this poem by Khaled Hosseini, written to commemorate 2 year-old Alan Kurdi, who drowned in the Mediterranean in 2015.

All of us impatient for sunrise,
all of us in dread of it.
All of us in search of home.
I have heard it said we are the uninvited.
We are the unwelcome.
We should take our misfortune elsewhere.
But I hear your mother's voice over the tide, and she whispers in my ear,
"Oh, but if they saw, my darling,
Even half of what you have.
If only they saw.
They would say kinder things, surely."
