Are you Elijah?' He said, 'I am not.' 'Are you the prophet?' He answered, 'No.' ²² Then they said to him, 'Who are you? Let us have an answer for those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?' ²³ He said, 'I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness,

[&]quot;Make straight the way of the Lord", as the prophet Isaiah said.

²⁴ Now they had been sent from the Pharisees. ²⁵ They asked him, '

²⁶ John answered them, 'I baptize with water. Among you stands one whom you do not know,

²⁷ the one who is coming after me; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandal.'

²⁸ This took place in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing.

May there be honesty, transparency, care and concern for all involved. Advent God,

hear our prayer.

For those who are frightened of the weeks to come because of debt that burdens them, because of no or not enough work, or insufficient income.

For those who must choose between eating or heating. For those upset that they can't give the gifts they want to those they love and care for.

Advent God,

hear our prayer.

For those who are ill, physical or mental illness, who can see no improvement nor a path to better health. For those who await tests and operations, fearful of the outcome and their future prospects. For those who are dying and know that death is near, may they know care, love and support and may they feel enveloped in a peace beyond understanding. Advent God,

hear our prayer.

For all those we will meet and share with this coming week, that they may see through us the light of Christ.

That they may feel your love and presence through us.

That they may see what a difference you make to our lives and experience for themselves what a difference you can make to their lives.

May love, joy, hope, peace, light and life be shared amongst us.

Bless us, Almighty God, and those for whom we have prayed. **Amen.**
